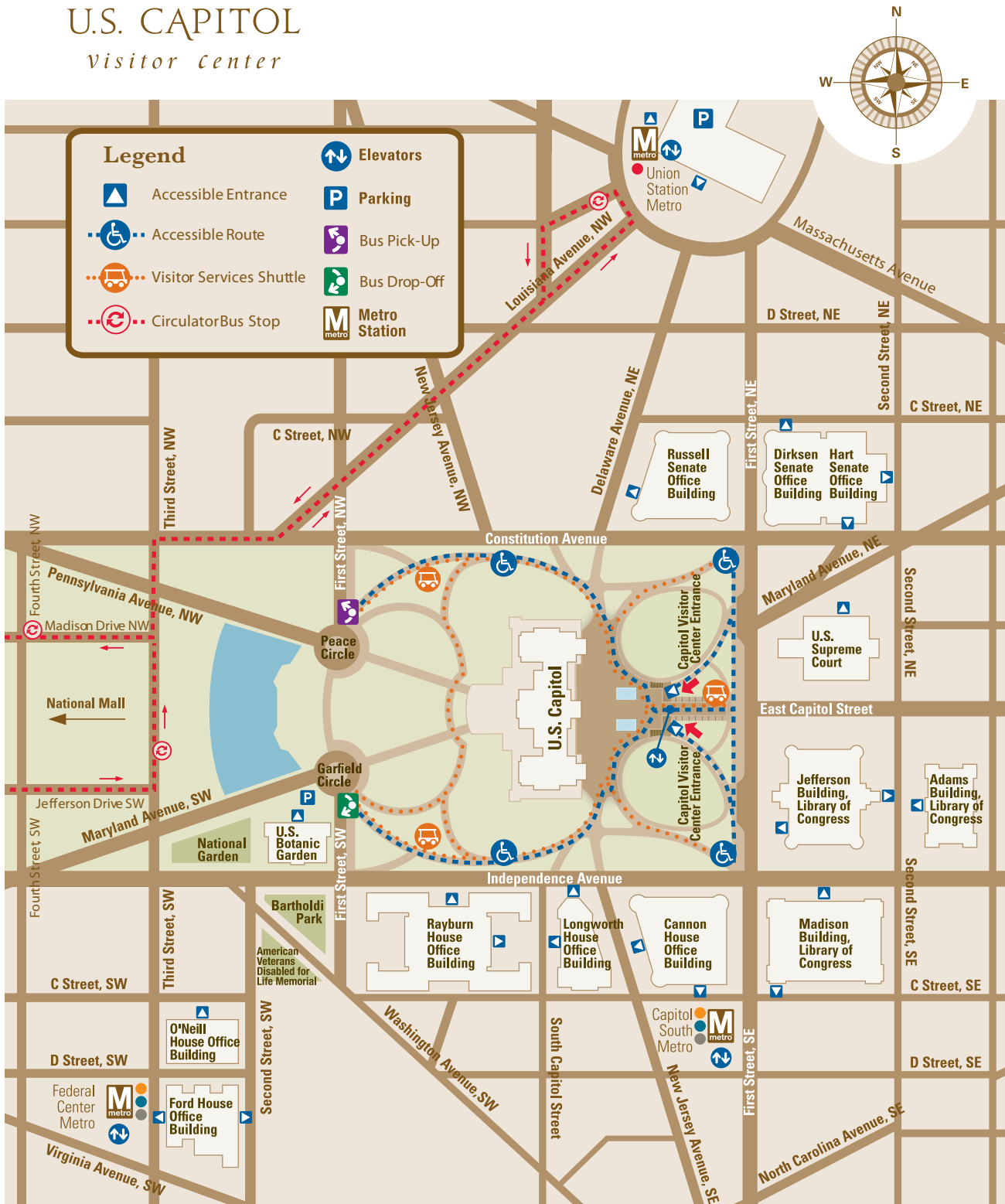

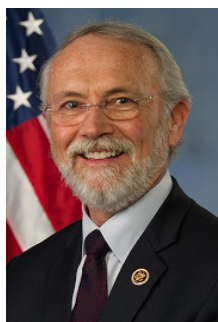


Keynote Speakers



SONNY PERDUE *Secretary of Agriculture*

Sonny Perdue came by his knowledge of agriculture the old fashioned way: he was born into a farming family in Bonaire, Georgia. From childhood, and through his life in business and elected office, Perdue has experienced the industry from every possible perspective. Under Secretary Perdue, the USDA is facts-based and data-driven, with a decision-making mindset that is customer-focused. As the former governor of Georgia, he is a strong believer in good government who will seek solutions to problems and not lament that the agency might be faced with difficult challenges. His four guiding principles are clear: to maximize the ability of American agriculture to create jobs, sell foods and fiber, and feed and clothe the world; to prioritize customer service for the taxpayers; to ensure that our food supply is safe and secure; and to maintain good stewardship of the natural resources that provide us with our miraculous bounty. And understanding that we live in a global economy where trade is of top importance, Secretary Perdue has pledged to be an unapologetic advocate for American agriculture.



DAN NEWHOUSE *Congressman*

Representative Dan Newhouse is a lifelong resident of Central Washington and is honored to represent the 4th District in Congress. A third-generation Yakima Valley farmer, Dan brings real-world experience to Congress as a businessman and former state legislator ready to work hard in support of conservative solutions that encourage job creation and economic opportunity in Central Washington. Dan understands that looking out for taxpayers means that Congress must stay on budget and make the government work efficiently to fulfill its responsibilities.

Dan serves on two committees with jurisdiction on critical legislative issues for the 4th District; these include the Appropriations and Selection Committee on the Modernization of Congress committees.

Dan served four terms as a legislator in the Washington State House of Representatives, representing the 15th Legislative District from 2003 to 2009. In the Legislature, Dan earned a reputation as a principled conservative willing to work with colleagues to support policies that foster economic growth.

From 2009 to 2013, Dan served as Director of Washington State's Department of Agriculture, where he listened to the concerns of Washington farmers and promoted the state's agricultural resources.

Dan attended Washington State University, where he earned a Bachelor of Science degree in Agricultural Economics. Dan is also a graduate of the Washington Agriculture and Forestry Leadership Program.

Dan lives in Sunnyside with his wife, Joan. He has two adult children: Jensena, Devon and his wife Halley. The Newhouse family continues to operate a 750-acre farm where they grow hops, tree fruit and grapes.



MICHAEL (MIKE) K. SIMPSON *Congressman*

Michael (Mike) K. Simpson is serving his eleventh term in the House of Representatives for Idaho's Second Congressional District.

Mike serves on the House Appropriations Committee. He is the Ranking Member for the Subcommittee on Energy and Water Development. He also serves on the Interior and Environment Subcommittee. These committees have jurisdiction over funding for a number of programs critical to Idaho, including the Department of Energy, the Department of the Interior, the Forest Service, our National Parks, the National Endowment for the Arts, and Smithsonian Institute.

Simpson is one of the House's leading advocates for a new energy policy and a renewed commitment to research and development of improved nuclear energy technologies. Mike has also gained national attention for his bill to split the massive, overburdened 9th Circuit Court of Appeals as well as his Sawtooth National Recreation Area and Jerry Peak Wilderness Additions Act which addresses the concerns of economic growth and stability for rural Idaho and resolves long time wilderness debate over the Boulder-White Clouds and was signed into law in August of 2015. Simpson has long championed a fix to fire borrowing, having authored the Wildfire Disaster Funding Act. Simpson's leadership led to the passage of the FY18 Omnibus Spending Bill that provided historic forest management reforms, most notably treating wildfires like other natural disasters. This Congress, Simpson co-authored the Farm Workforce Modernization Act that passed the House in December 2019 and takes important steps towards solving the labor crisis that agriculture is facing.

His political career began in 1980, when he was elected to the Blackfoot City Council. In 1984, he was elected to the Idaho Legislature where he served until 1998, the last six years serving as Speaker. Simpson was born in Burley, Idaho and raised in Blackfoot. He graduated from Utah State University and earned his DMD from Washington University School of Dental Medicine in St. Louis, Missouri. After graduation, he joined his father and uncle at the Simpson Family Dental Practice in Blackfoot.

Simpson married his high school sweetheart, Kathy, and they have been married for 50 years as of June this year. He is an avid golfer and reader who also enjoys painting and experiencing the exceptional scenery Idaho has to offer, with Kathy and their dog Charley.



JIMMY PANETTA *Congressman*

Congressman Jimmy Panetta is dedicated to public service and proudly serves California's 20th Congressional District in the U.S. House of Representatives. His district includes Monterey and San Benito Counties, and parts of Santa Cruz and Santa Clara Counties. First elected 2016, he is serving his second term in Congress. He currently serves on the House Committee on Ways and Means, the House Committee on Budget, and the House Committee on Agriculture.

Having grown up on the central coast of California, Congressman Panetta understands the importance of giving back to the community and country that gave him and his family so much. He was instilled with a sense of public service and its importance to our democracy, and has made sure that his work is reflective of the values of the people who entrusted him to be their voice in our nation's capital.

During his time in Congress, he has fought for immigration reform, the continued protection of our pristine coastline and environment, affordable and accessible health care, to ensure that our agriculture industry and its farmers and farmworkers are taken care of, to reduce gun violence, for our military installations which are an integral part in our community and our country's national security, and for our veterans to receive the benefits that they were promised and deserve. Through policy implementation in Congress and service to constituents, he remains committed to being that bridge for the people of the Central Coast to the federal government and its resources.

Prior to being sworn in Congress, Congressman Panetta served his community as a deputy district attorney for Monterey County, which includes the city of Salinas. In this role, he prosecuted violent gang members to pursue justice for victims, protect families and make communities safer.

In 2007, Congressman Panetta volunteered for active duty and was deployed to Afghanistan in support of Operation Enduring Freedom. He worked with Special Forces units and as a result of his meritorious service in a combat zone, Congressman Panetta was awarded the Bronze Star. Upon returning home, he served as a board member of the Veterans Transition Center where he focused on ending veterans' homelessness and improving resources for his fellow veterans and their families. He was also instrumental in the opening of Monterey County's first Veterans Treatment Court to ensure veterans receive the services they earned. Moreover, he worked with local leaders and veterans to establish the Central Coast Veterans Cemetery on the former Fort Ord. He was honored to be named a Monterey County Veteran of the Year in 2015.

Growing up in Monterey County, Congressman Panetta attended Monterey Peninsula College and the local public schools. He graduated from the University of California at Davis with an undergraduate degree in International Relations and earned his law degree from Santa Clara University. His wife, Carrie McIntyre Panetta, is a Superior Court judge in Monterey County, and they have two daughters, Siri and Gia.



Note from Michael

Welcome to the National Council of Agricultural Employers' 56th Annual Meeting. We constantly strive to bring quality content to each of our programs and we are confident this year's Annual Meeting will not disappoint. We are excited you are here.

2019 was an exceptionally busy year for NCAE. It was jam packed with activity.

Early in the year, we were hip deep in litigation brought against the Department of Labor (DOL). NCAE was challenging the Adverse Effect Wage Rate (AEWR) that was to be utilized in the H-2A temporary agricultural worker program. We argued effectively that the Secretary of Labor had failed to make any determination of an adverse effect being visited on domestic workers as a result of employment of H-2A workers. As a result, we argued, since there was no adverse effect, there should be no AEWR.

Unfortunately, the Court determined it lacked subject matter jurisdiction over the matter as the statute of limitations regarding the regulation had expired in 2016. However, we kept up the fight by filing a petition with the Secretary to hold a hearing on our complaint.

Finally, in January last year, NCAE was able to secure a meeting with the Department of Homeland Security (DHS). NCAE had asked for this meeting the prior summer. The meeting that brought H-2A users and agents from across the country, sought to remedy to significant processing challenges involving the US Citizenship and Immigration Services and Customs and Border Patrol. This was a very strange meeting in that the DHS personnel listened to our concerns but could not dialogue with our group. This remains unfinished business.

Last Spring, a small group primarily comprised of NCAE members was asked by the leadership of the House Judiciary Committee to develop legislation addressing the agricultural labor crisis. This would be an attempt to pass the first agricultural labor legislation through the House since 1986. Facing off against agriculture was the United Farm Workers labor union. Negotiations continued through the summer and fall on provisions to protect the current farm workforce and streamline the H-2A program.

In December, bipartisan legislation, HR 5038 the Farm Workforce Modernization Act, passed out of the Judiciary Committee to the Floor. Recognizing this legislation had concerning flaws but desiring to see a more employer-friendly bill emerge in the Senate, NCAE supported moving the bill forward in the process. NCAE has been part of the team working in the Senate to craft such legislation.

During our H-2A calls late last spring, we learned of problems employers were having with denials of H-2A petitions involving farm labor contractors. The problem persisted and NCAE was asked to join litigation to enjoin the Secretary from using this novel regulatory interpretation absent compliance with the regulatory scheme.

The Court agreed and the Secretary has sought reconsideration by the Court.

Early in the Trump Administration, NCAE traveled to the White House to discuss agricultural labor issues and sought significant reform to the H-2A program. The President heard our concerns.

In May 2018, the four Cabinet Secretaries of Labor, Agriculture, Homeland Security and State issued a memo confirming they were working together to deliver meaningful reform. In July 2019, the DOL released 489 pages of proposed regulatory changes to the H-2A program.

NCAE convened an ad hoc committee comprised of four attorney members, our H-2A committee chair and me to dig into the rulemaking and develop proposed comments for NCAE and our members. It was a terrific experience to work alongside some of the very talented people that thrive in NCAE's membership. The group did its job, and comments were filed in September. Hopefully, we will see the Department's final rule sometime this spring.

NCAE also filed comments with the Department regarding a proposed rule firming up the parameters of what might constitute joint employment. The Department published the results of this effort and it is consistent with the comments filed by NCAE.

Late this year, NCAE filed comments opposing a massive increase in USCIS fees that was proposed for named beneficiaries on petitions. The Service has extended the comment period on this proposal.

2019 was a very busy year and 2020 is shaping up to be more of the same. You are in DC at a perfect time to have your voices heard and, hopefully, to achieve some meaningful changes on the issues that matter most to us and our members.

H-2A COMMITTEE 393 Participants

(Troy Frostad and Ryan Ayres, 2019 Co-Chairs)

*Monitors and keeps members informed of legislative and regulatory initiatives related to agricultural temporary guest worker programs (H-2A). This committee also makes recommendations to the board of directors on Council positions and develops comments and testimony designed to further Council goals.**

IMMIGRATION COMMITTEE 30 Participants

(Diane Kurrle and Craig Regelbrugge, 2019 Co-Chairs)

Monitors and keeps members informed of legislative and regulatory initiatives related to the Immigration Reform and Control Act (IRCA). The Immigration Committee makes recommendations to the board of directors on Council positions and develops comments and testimony designed to further Council goals. *Includes Immigration Reform issues and serves as primary liaison with ACIR coalition.**

LABOR RELATIONS & REGULATIONS COMMITTEE 52 Participants

(Susan Quale and Carmen Ponce, 2019 Co-Chairs)

Works with Congress and government agencies to advance agricultural employer's interests during the development of employee benefits legislation and regulations, keeps members informed of these developments, and coordinates industry and Council comments on such actions. The scope of this committee includes the responsibilities of the previous EPA/OSHA Committee (also known as Workplace Health and Safety Committee) and deals with all labor, employment relations, and regulatory issues.
